Headteacher, Ms Aspinall and Senior Assistant Head, Mrs Bennett, were delighted to accompany Mr Howe, our Chair of Governors, to a Buckingham Palace garden party recently. Mr Howe is stepping down this year but will continue to serve on our local governing body. The invite was extended by the Lieutenancy of Merseyside in recognition of Mr Howe's long-standing services to education and local politics. Prior to joining our board of governors over twenty years ago, Mr Howe spent his career as a teacher in Liverpool, working as a primary head in two different schools. As well as his work in schools, Mr Howe, a resident of Maghull since 1977, was a local councillor for many years, serving as Mayor of Maghull twice. During his time as a councillor, he represented Sefton Council on the Merseyside Police Authority, sitting as Chair of the Professional Standards Committee. We are so pleased that Mr Howe's service has been recognised in this way and thank him for his continued support of our school.

Youth Empower Conference



Transition




