Hello and welcome to this academic year's third edition of Maghull High School News. It has been a busy half term, with lots of extra-curricular activity and our Y13 students working hard on their UCAS applications. The last few weeks have flown by can't believe it's half term already! We hope you all have a relaxing and enjoyable week off and we very much look forward to seeing you on Tuesday, 21 February.

Attendance Matters

Students from last year's year eleven cohort who had 95% attendance or above achieved on average one and a quarter grades higher than expected at GCSE, whilst those with 90% or below attendance achieved almost a grade lower than they should have done across the board.

0 days of school	100%	Perfection
Equates to 2 days off school each year	99%	Excellent
Equates to 5 days off school each year	97%	Good
Equates to 10 days off school each year	95%	Slight Concern
Equates to 20 days off school each year	90%	Concerned
Equates to 30 days off school each year	85%	Very Concerned

At the mid point of the academic year, we remain concerned at the number of students who fall into the 'persistent absence' category, that is they have missed 10% or more of school days so far. It is vital that every child strives for at least good attendance. Children who are persistently absent have gaps in learning, miss social time with friends, and engage in fewer extra-curricular activities. The impact of this absence on student outcomes is significant — every extra day missed at school is associated with a lower attainment at GCSE and can affect next steps and wider life chances. The impact of those twenty days off across an academic year can really be seen in the figures above and has a knock on effect on students' next steps. We politely remind parents and carers that holidays in term time will not be authorised.

Children's Mental Health Week



We were proud to once again support Place2Be's Children's Mental Health Week, which this year had the theme of 'Let's Connect', encouraging children and young people to connect with others in healthy, rewarding, and meaningful ways. The Phoenix Centre provided tutors with resources to share throughout the week, to help reinforce the importance of connection with others and assemblies on the theme were delivered, supported by our Mental Health Support Team and Everton Tackling the Blues. Our wellbeing student ambassadors visited other students to share tips on how we can positively interact and connect with others in a helpful way.

Year 10 Study Skills Session




