As a school we are always looking for opportunities and ways to educate our pupils on how to keep themselves safe. We have decided to team up with #kNOwKnifeCrime campaign and London Marathon 2024 and we will be fundraising for bleeding control kits and cabinets for outside our schools in Sefton. We will be having a mini-marathon event in our school the week of 15th April 2024 where KS3 pupils will participate in running 2.6 miles in our school grounds. For participating in this event all children will receive a London mini marathon certificate and our school will receive a trophy. On Wednesday 17th April, representatives from each school will run a relay event, passing on a bleed control kit to the next nearest school. This is to demonstrate how we are working together to keep our communities safe and how we want our localities well-resourced in the event someone is in need of medical assistance. 84 schools in Sefton are also participating in this event!


# Y8 York Trip: Gothic Literature




In addition to this, Charlie

3-0 with Charlie himself scoring a goal. Charlie is also captain of his local team, River Juniors.






# National Reading Champions Quiz
