Regular school attendance is crucial for your child's educational progress. Being present allows children to form lasting friendships, develop essential interpersonal skills, and contribute to better mental health and overall well-





Schools must only grant leaves of absence for specific circumstances set out in the 2024 attendance regulations.

# The permitted circumstances are:

- · Taking part in a regulated performance or employment
- Attending an interview
- Study leave
- · A temporary, time-limited part-time timetable
- Exceptional circumstances

See the guidance (paragraph 37)

Unfortunately a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.





# Penalty Notice Changes (\$



There are significant changes to penalty notices for unauthorised absences during term time, effective from 19 August 2024.

What you need to know:



New penalty rates:

£160 per parent per child, £80 if paid within 21 days.



Second offence within 3 years: £160 with no discount.



Penalty after 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised This includes late arrivals after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or absence in a rolling 10-school week period



Max 2 penalties in 3 years per child. Further offences may lead to prosecution.

School registers close at 9.15am. The guidance states, "f a pupil...arrives...after the register has closed, the attendance register must be amended to record them as absent using code U or another absence code that is more appropriate.

This means that a child who arrives between 9.15am and 12.25pm will be marked as an unauthorised absence, unless there is a reason set out in the authorised absences section.

### Uniform Policy

- Students are to wear the correct uniform at all times with shirt/blouse tucked in
- · Ties to display at least 4 stripes and with top buttons fastened. Clip on ties are recommended.
- · All students to wear in years 7, 8 and 9 wear a blazer.
- . Blazers should be worn at all times around school and can be taken off in lessons at the teacher's discretion.
- Blazers are not to be kept in bags, coats are not to be used in place of a blazer.
- · All students to wear a jumper in years 10 and 11.
- · One outdoor coat is permitted in school and should be removed before entering classrooms and assembly halls.

### Footwear

- · All students to wear appropriate school shoes that are flat, ankle high and polishable.
- . Trainers and boots are not allowed to be worn during the school day.
- · We do not allow any sportswear branded school shoes including Adidas, Hoka, Lonsdale, Nike, New Balance, Asics, On Cloud or Puma.
- . Trainers can be worn during PE lessons or if playing sports on the field at lunchtime.
- . If worn at lunchtime, students are to ensure they change back into their school shoes
- · Any student arriving to school wearing trainers will be given a standards log, and issued with school shoes to wear.

# **Staffing Updates**



At the end of half term, our long-standing Assistant SENDCO, Mrs Bailey, retired from Maghull High School. Having worked in our school for over 20 years, Mrs Bailey has worked phenomenally hard in supporting the leadership of our Inclusion department. Mrs Bailey has helped many students and their families over the years overcome learning difficulties and the challenges they face. Mrs Bailey will return to support the Inclusion team on a part-time basis over the coming weeks to ensure all students continue to receive high quality education and support.





On Wednesday 6 November, all staff attended professional development training led by Assistant Headteacher responsible for Teaching and Learning, Miss Murphy, and our newly appointed Teaching and Learning Leads, Miss Gregory, Miss Bell and Miss Shannon. Staff have currently been focusing development around behaviour for learning within the classroom, which lends itself well in line with the launch of our new behaviour and attitudes policy. Using evidence-based research and reading from Tom Bennett's 'Running the Room' and Paul Dix 'When the Adults Change Everything Changes', staff explored how to embed high expectations and consistent routines to help motivate students. We considered the use of positive framing and reflection for students within lessons in order to build and maintain relationships.

Our Digital Development Leader, Mrs Burns, provided training for all staff around the use of digital resources and access to online platforms. The aim of the Digital Streamlining CPD for staff was to build up confidence on our Cloud based online software. This started with an overview of basics, leading to a step-by-step model of how we use Teams to encourage and empower our own processes in school, whilst also supporting our students with a consistent approach. One focus is for our Homework Hub area to be clear for all staff and students so we can work together in achieving. The CPD allowed for further learning on our Staff Digital Training Hub.
