


The Maghull High Pledge: Year 8 Wellbeing Afternoon

School Uniform and Standards.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers of our uniform and standards expectations. We understand that we are entering into the last month of the year, and the final few weeks of what has been a long term. However, keeping our standards raised is imperative. We want to ensure students are able to get the basics right and set them up for a successful day in school, in-line with the Maghull High Way.

ALL students must arrive to school wearing correct, full uniform in line with our behaviour policy. One coat, in addition to blazers and/or jumpers is permitted to be worn around school. Trainers of any kind are not permitted in school, except at lunchtime if students wish to participate in activities on the field, or as a result of medical evidence. All students are expected to have a bag with them every day, and a fully stocked pencil case. Pencil cases can be purchased via Student Reception if needed. Jewellery is not permitted in school except for one pair of studded earrings. Mobile phones, ear-pods and fizzy drinks are not permitted at any time on our school site. Any items not permitted will be confiscated and returned to students at the end of the school day. Where a student is not wearing the correct uniform, fails to carry equipment or a school bag, they will receive a 'Standards and Expectations Log' on Arbor. Students can also be logged for 'Standards and Expectations' if they fail to hand in homework on time, are late to lessons, or are in possession of items not permitted in school. Such logs can equate to an after-school detention should they accumulate three or more.

STEM Club: UniLever Competition



The Unilever Bright Future Inspire Programme aims to get students engaged with STEM subjects by introducing them to the sorts of activities that take place on site at a global organisation's Research and Development site. A team of 5 students from Y8 attended a day of workshops at Prenton Park each hosted by Unilever Port Sunlight employees from the following on-site functions:

The workshops introduce students to the work done within each of the functions, as well as highlighting the different types of roles and entry routes available within a global organisation such as Unilever. Following the workshops, teams are set a real-world product design challenge, which they work on for several months, in school and with the support of their teacher, before returning in March, along with all the other school teams, to take part in the Inspire Celebration and Assessment Day.

Regular Attendance



Regular school attendance is crucial for your child's educational progress. Being present allows children to form lasting friendships, develop essential interpersonal skills, and contribute to better mental health and overall well-





Schools must only grant leaves of absence for specific circumstances set out in the 2024 attendance regulations.

The permitted circumstances are:

- · Taking part in a regulated performance or employment
- Attending an interview
- Study leave
- · A temporary, time-limited part-time timetable
- Exceptional circumstances

See the guidance (paragraph 37)

Unfortunately a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.







Penalty Notice Changes (\$



There are significant changes to penalty notices for unauthorised absences during term time, effective from 19 August 2024.

What you need to know:



New penalty rates:

£160 per parent per child, £80 if paid within 21 days.



Second offence within 3 years: £160 with no discount.



Penalty after 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10-school week period

The 10 school weeks may span different terms or This includes late arrivals after the register closes. school years.



Max 2 penalties in 3 years per child. Further offences may lead to prosecution.

School registers close at 9.15am. The guidance states, "f a pupil...arrives...after the register has closed, the attendance register must be amended to record them as absent using code U or another absence code that is more appropriate.

This means that a child who arrives between 9.15am and 12.25pm will be marked as an unauthorised absence, unless there is a reason set out in the authorised absences section.


