School Uniform and Standards.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers of our uniform and standards expectations. We understand that we are entering into the last month of the year, and the final few weeks of what has been a long term. However, keeping our standards raised is imperative. We want to ensure students are able to get the basics right and set them up for a successful day in school, in-line with the Maghull High Way.

ALL students must arrive to school wearing correct, full uniform in line with our behaviour policy. One coat, in addition to blazers and/or jumpers is permitted to be worn around school. Trainers of any kind are not permitted in school, except at lunchtime if students wish to participate in activities on the field, or as a result of medical evidence. All students are expected to have a bag with them every day, and a fully stocked pencil case. Pencil cases can be purchased via Student Reception if needed. Jewellery is not permitted in school except for one pair of studded earrings. Mobile phones, ear-pods and fizzy drinks are not permitted at any time on our school site. Any items not permitted will be confiscated and returned to students at the end of the school day. Where a student is not wearing the correct uniform, fails to carry equipment or a school bag, they will receive a 'Standards and Expectations Log' on Arbor. Students can also be logged for 'Standards and Expectations' if they fail to hand in homework on time, are late to lessons, or are in possession of items not permitted in school. Such logs can equate to an after-school detention should they accumulate three or more.

Knife Crime Event

Young people from across Merseyside were invited to help tackle knife crime at an event organised by Merseyside Police Safer School's Coordinator, Faye Smith and took place at Goodison Park on Monday 25th November supported by Everton In The Community and LFC Foundation. The tournament forms part of the Police force's dedicated approach to tackle serious violence and knife crime through education, prevention and engagement.

Young people aged 11-13 were invited from a number of schools across the Liverpool City Region participated in a football tournament and sessions regarding the consequences of carrying a knife or being involved in others who make that choice.



Young Carers

Students who are identified as young carers attended the first group session this afternoon. Students have been able to share their experiences with each other and feel connected. We are looking forward to the next one already.

What is a Young Carer?

Someone aged 18 or under who helps look after a relative with a condition, disability, illness, mental health condition, or a drug or alcohol problem.

Most young carers look after a parent, brother or sister or grandparent. They may do extra jobs in the home, such as cooking, cleaning, or helping someone to get dressed and move around. Sometimes they may not do much actual care but are impacted significantly by living in the same household

Some children give a lot of physical help to a person who is disabled or ill. They may also be giving emotional support.

The school nurse continues to hold weekly drop in sessions in the Phoenix Centre every Monday. Student can drop in without an appointment or can arrange an appointment by visiting the Phoenix Centre.

Regular school attendance is crucial for your child's educational progress. Being present allows children to form lasting friendships, develop essential interpersonal skills, and contribute to better mental health and overall wellbeing.



Schools must only grant leaves of absence for specific circumstances set out in the 2024 attendance regulations.

The permitted circumstances are:

- Taking part in a regulated performance or employment abroad
- Attending an interview
- Study leave
- A temporary, time-limited part-time timetable
- Exceptional circumstances

See the guidance (paragraph 37).

Unfortunately a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.







There are significant changes to penalty notices for unauthorised absences during term time, effective from 19 August 2024.

What you need to know:



Second offence within 3 years:



ELGO with no discount.

Penalty after 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10-school week period. This includes late arrivals after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.



Max 2 penalties in 3 years per child. Further offences may lead to prosecution.


School registers close at 9.15am. The guidance states, 'If a pupil...arrives...after the register has closed, the attendance register must be amended to record them as absent using code U or another absence code that is more appropriate.'

This means that a child who arrives between 9.15am and 12.25pm will be marked as an unauthorised absence, unless there is a reason set out in the authorised absences section.
